Currency Is the information current?

- \Box When was the information published?
- \Box Are the links working?
- \Box Is the information current enough for your topic?

Relevance Is the information related to your topic?

- □ Does the information help answer your inquiry question?
- \Box Is the information written at an appropriate level for you?
- □ Have you looked at a variety of sources before deciding to use this one?

Authority Is the author credible?

- \Box Who is the author?
- \Box What are the credentials of the author?
- \Box Is the author qualified or an expert on the topic?
- □ Who is the publisher? Look at the URL of the source as well (.edu, .gov., .org, .net, .com)
 - .com—a commercial website
 - .gov—a government owned/operated website
 - .org—a website associated with an organization
 - .edu—a website associated with an educational institution
 - .net—a website used by network providers

Accuracy Is the content correct?

- \Box Is the content reliable, truthful, and unbiased?
- \Box Is the information supported by evidence?
- \Box Is the content free of spelling, grammar, and typographical errors?

Purpose Is the purpose to inform or teach?

- \Box Why has the author published the information?
- \Box Does the author make their intentions or purpose clear?
- □ Does the point of view appear objective and impartial? Is the information fact? Opinion?
