### **Citation – APA 7**

A **Reference** list at the end of your paper on its own page (**the list must be in *alphabetical order with hanging indentation and double-spaced***). The title is called References and it is centered on the top of the page (see page 3).

### **Creating Reference Entries – Main Elements**

<b>AUTHOR</b>	Who wrote the information?	Writer, editor, group author, etc.
<b>DATE</b>	When was the information published?	Year of publication or the date of an update for a webpage
<b>TITLE</b>	What is the title of the work?	Article title, book title, graph title, etc.
<b>SOURCE</b>	Where did you find the information?	Publisher of a book, URL for an online work URL (Uniform Resource Locator)

### **How to Create an APA Reference Entry**

#### **Source: Textbook**

##### Example

Cranny, M., & Moles, G. (2010). *Counterpoints: Exploring Canadian issues* (2nd ed.). Pearson.

#### **Source: Webpage with date and author known**

Last name of author, First initial(s). (Year, Month date of publication). *Article title*. URL

##### Example

Hutch, M. (2017, June 9). *Here's a look at famous inventions made by Canadians*.

#### **Source: Webpage with group author and no date**

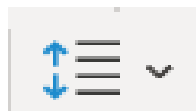

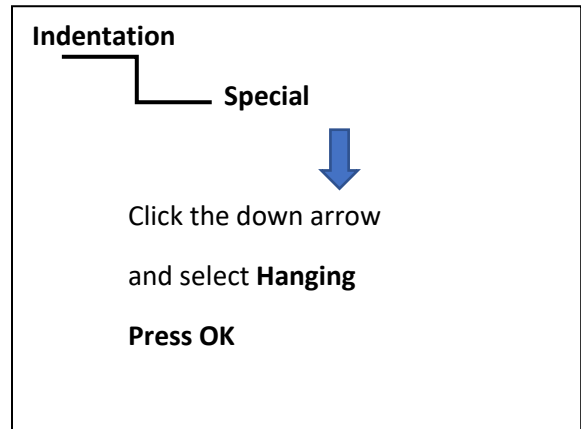
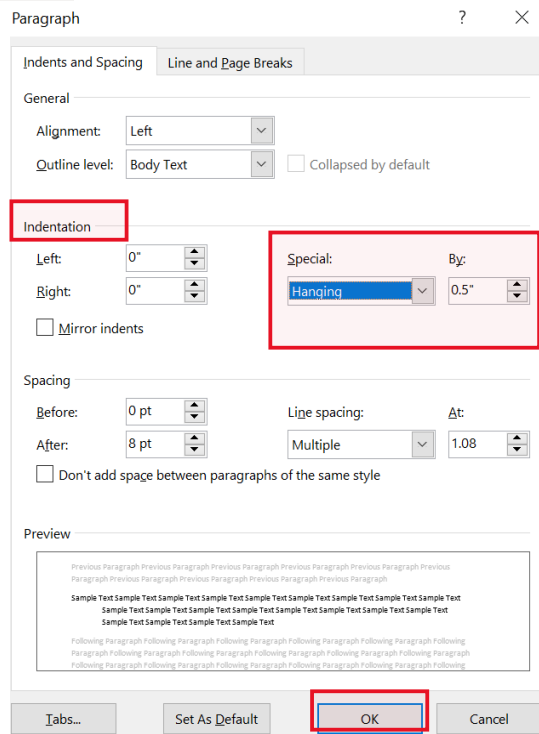

**How to format the hanging indentation on Microsoft Word:**



**Line and Paragraph Spacing:** Click the down arrow and select Line Spacing

**\*Remember to highlight all the reference entries first**



Steps to format hanging indentation on **Google Docs**: **Format** ➡ **Align & Indent** ➡

➡ **Indentation Options** – **Special Indent** – select **Hanging (0.5 inches)** – Press **APPLY**
